TWEP

The Tutoring/Work Experience Program (TWEP) program is now available to those interested. This program is for post-secondary students who will be returning to school in the fall and aims to assist them in earning tuition vouchers towards their education. These students will assist students prepare for public exams and other school examinations.

The TWEP program suggests the following selection criteria for tutor selection:

- "It is recommended that a tutor have prior experience and training with the high school Tutoring for Tuition Program.
- Other tutor training/experience.
- Academic standing
- Career relatedness, such as students enrolled in MUN's Education Faculty.
- Financial need"

We have been awarded five positions for this program. Any post secondary students who are interested in participating in the TWEP must pick up an application at the school or arrange to have one picked up. Deadline for applications is Monday, April 18th. Work will begin on May 9th.
